Engagiert, couragiert und selbstlos: IPA Deutschland ehrt Lebensretter

Zum zweiten Mal ehrte die IPA Deutschland Bürger, die sich für die Polizei einsetzen. Präsident Oliver Hoffmann übergab den „IPA Polizei- und Bürgerpreis“ im Polizeipräsidium Bochum: „Es ist mir eine Freude diese besondere Auszeichnung für Zivilcourage heute in Namen der IPA Deutschland übergeben zu dürfen. Denn klar ist: Dem reaktionsschnellen und vorbildlichen Handeln der Ersthelferinnen und -helfer ist es zu verdanken, dass beide Polizeibeamte gerettet werden konnten und weiterhin am Leben sind.“

Was ist passiert? Ein Streifenwagen der Polizei Bochum kommt von der Fahrbahn ab, prallt gegen einen Baum und fängt Feuer. Eine Gruppe junger Menschen, die gerade auf dem Rückweg von einer Abi-Party sind, entdeckten den brennenden Streifenwagen und eilten sofort zur Hilfe. Sie befreiten die 24-jährige Beamtin und den 30-jährigen Beamten aus dem Streifenwagen und leisteten Erste-Hilfe, bis die Rettungskräfte eintrafen und die beiden Schwerverletzten ins Krankenhaus brachten. Insgesamt waren zehn Personen im Alter zwischen 18 und 30 Jahren an dieser Rettungsaktion beteiligt. „Der Kontrast hätte größer nicht sein können: Wir haben an dem Abend unser Abitur gefeiert. Und dann kam dieser schreckliche Unfall“, sagte einer der Helfenden.

Committed, courageous and selfless: IPA Germany honors rescuers

For the second time, the IPA Germany honored citizens who work exceptionally well for the police. President Oliver Hoffmann presented the "IPA Police and Citizens' Prize" at the police headquarters in Bochum: "I am delighted to be able to present this special award for civil courage today on behalf of the IPA Germany. Because one thing is clear: it is thanks to the quick and exemplary actions of the first responders that both police officers could be rescued and are still alive."

What happened? A patrol car from the Bochum police left the road, crashed into a tree and caught fire. A group of young people returning from a graduation party spotted the burning patrol car and immediately rushed to help. They freed the 24-year-old officer and the 30-year-old officer from the patrol car and provided first aid until paramedics arrived and took the two seriously injured to the hospital. A total of ten people between the ages of 18 and 30 were involved in this rescue operation. "The contrast could not have been greater: we celebrated our graduation that evening and then this terrible accident happened," said one of the helpers.

Arthur Troop—Founder of International Police Association

ARTHUR TROOP SCHOLARSHIP

The Arthur Troop Scholarship (ATS), as a legacy to Arthur Troop, the founder of IPA, is a professional education and advanced training bursary, with the aim of aiding IPA members in their professional careers and promoting the International Police Association.

The Arthur Troop Scholarships are awarded annually at the IPA World Congress, at least one for each continent in which an IPA Section exist. This Includes Africa, America, Australasia, Asia.

A total budget of €25,000 is set side annually for the Arthur Troop Scholarship. Each awardee may receive a bursary of up to €2,500 which shall contribute to the cost of the seminar, conference, or symposium fee, as well as travel and accommodation expenses. It may be used for a seminar at the International Conference Centre IBZ Schloss Gimborn, or at a comparable institution.

Applicants must have been a member of the IPA for a minimum of 3 years and must currently be performing a law enforcement role. ATS is predominantly targeted at the younger members. The closing date for sending completed application forms for the following calendar year to the IAC, is 31 March 2023. Any applications received after this date will be taken into consideration for the following year.

Each ATS must be used between 1 January and 31 December of the year following the granting of the scholarship. Awardees who are unable to use their scholarships in the relevant year due to extraordinary circumstances may have the bursary carried over to the following year. The Chairperson of the PC shall be the final arbitrator.

The ATS is a fantastic bursary for our IPA serving Police Officers. As Chair of the Chairperson of Professional Commission, I am encouraging all members to search <https://forms.gle/ATS Online Application Form> and consult the 'Procedure for the ATS' at [procedure for the scholarship](#) Members who receive the ATS must submit a report and photographs to CPC with their application for re-imbusement of their expenses. IPA Slovenia successfully marked its 30th anniversary and XII. IPA Slovenia congress, which took place on the 22nd of October in Dobrna.



The morning began solemnly. The anniversary was attended by many domestic and foreign guests from as many as 9 countries, representatives of friendly and partner organisations. Among the special guests of the ceremony were the Minister of Internal Affairs, M.Sc. Tatjana Bobnar and Deputy General Director of the Police Igor Ciperla, who also addressed the gathering.

The ceremony was enriched by the members of the Police Orchestra and a young policewoman, outstanding vocalist Klavdija Trnovšek.

DAUGHTER OF SPANISH IPA MEMBER...

At the beginning of September 2022, IPA HQ received an email from a Spanish IPA member asking for urgent assistance. Lucia, daughter of IPA Spanish member Rosa, had booked university accommodation in Greenwich for this academic year. Upon Lucia's arrival at the accommodation it was apparent there had been an error in the booking administration. Two days notice was given to vacate the student bedsit with no alternative offered by the university accommodation.

London Reception Officer Alex Williams swung in to action with a telephone call to Lucia. Once the problem was unpicked, a multi-pronged plan was created to help secure safe university accommodation. The immediate risk of being turfed out onto the street was averted with an offer to collect her belongings and emergency accommodation in Sevenoaks at Alex's flat. Given the long and expensive commute this was a secondary plan. An improved plan quickly offered was accommodation for a week in Greenwich at Alex's cousins flat, conveniently located just a few minutes walk from Lucia's university. This temporary accommodation would provide a breathing space for Lucia to stay around Greenwich and search for other accommodation. With the pressure off, Lucia duly took the advice and went back to the accommodation office and was added to the emergency waiting list for a room. The website suggested was Spareroom.com and a room viewing was quickly arranged. Alex guided Lucia away from taking a room without a written contract (a big no no!), and over the following 24hrs Lucia was able to secure accommodation with a university friend following Alex's advice. Spanish IPA members also came to the rescue with telephone calls of further reassurance thereafter.

Two days later the London Reception Officer was delighted

to receive the emails below. This is great testimony to the strength of friendship amongst IPA members. This is our raison d'être - to help others and give friendship, in this case neither knew each other nor had ever met before...
